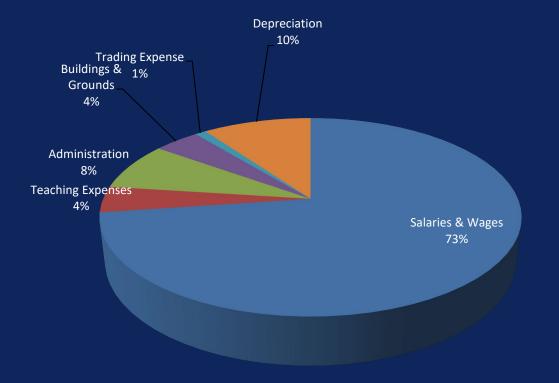

2021 v 2022 Expenditure



	2021	2022
Salaries & Wages	70%	73%
Teaching Expenses	5%	4%
Administration	9%	8%
Buildings & Grounds	4%	4%
Trading Expense	1%	1%
Depreciation	11%	10%
TOTAL	100%	100%

- 1. Salaries and wages increased from 2021
- 2. Administrative costs are down
- 3. Property and maintenance expenditure increased from 2021
- 4. Overall expenditure higher than 2021





2021 v 2022 Income



- 1. Fees are on budget and similar to last year
- 2. Thank you to the P&F and the school community for their continued contributions to the school
- 3. State Grants decreased from prior year due to new funding model
- 4. Federal Grants increased due to extra funding availability

















Funding Model

- Bilateral Agreement with Aus Govt to fund Non-Govt school
- State funding of 20% of the School Resource Standard (SRS)
- Federal funding of 80% of the SRS
- State Government transitioning funding
 - ➤ 2023 will see a decrease in state per capita funding to align with the target of 20% funding
- Federal Govt Grants budgeted to increase by 1%p.a. as a guaranteed minimum
- Funding model from 2024, which allows primary schools to be a more favourable position, will see an increase in funding

















2022 Capital Expenditure

- ✓ Improvements
 - ✓ Work room improvement
 - ✓ Toilet block refurbishment staff & visitors
 - ✓ Sacred space & nature playground reticulation
 - ✓ Completed last stage of electrical upgrades (3 year plan)
- ✓ Furniture and Fittings
 - ✓ Furniture for early years & social worker room















2023 Budget

Budget is provisional and dependent upon CEWA approval

Salient Points:

- Spending generally consistent with previous years
- Continued focus on capital improvements with \$300K targeted in 2023
- Overall result of a \$43k deficit this is significantly lower than previous years and a really good outcome given lower state funding and a new fee structure















2023 Planned Improvements

- ✓ Improvements (\$300k estimated)
 - ✓ Chapel
- ✓ Furniture and Fittings (\$7,000)



2023 Fee Structure

- K3 fees remain the same as last year
- Tuition fees have been restructured to include Italian fee. While it looks like a slight increase, there is an overall reduction
- There has been a decrease in the levies and other contributions
- Overall, this results in a 5% reduction in fees

Government Funding

- WA receives the highest per capita level of average funding for non-government schools of any state
- State funding will reduce annually until they contribute 20% of the School Resource Standard by 2023
- Federal funding will increase annually until they contribute 80% of the School Resource Standard by 2023
- School Resourcing Standard is an estimate of how much funding a school needs to meet educational needs of students
- Based on the 2011 Gonski Review of Funding for Schooling
- Current funding is 104.3% of the School Resource Standard
- It is estimated funding will reduce by 2-3% per annum until 2023
